BY THE NUMBERS:

Hawkeye Upland Experience

01

Our pointers will lock on point holding the birds tight as the guides and hunters prepare for the flush.

02

With flushing dogs at heel, our guides will position hunters for the best shot on each flush.

03

The flushing dogs will be sent in, and the birds take flight.

04

Repeat this process until your bag is full or your shells run out!
